The Livingston Theatre Company (LTC) is a home for theatrical arts at Rutgers University. Founded in the fall of 1998, the LTC provides quality and affordable musical theater to Rutgers students and the communities of Central New Jersey. The Livingston Theatre Company is open to all undergraduate students of Rutgers University, regardless of college affiliation or major. The LTC produces three musicals per year, all of which take place in the Livingston Student Center. The Core is the Livingston Campus radio station. From its early years broadcasting on an AM radio frequency to the Quads and Towers, The Core can be heard on 90.3 FM throughout much of New Jersey and online at [www.thecore.fm](http://www.thecore.fm). Its slogan "Many Voices, One Station" embodies the station's lineup of entertainment and information. The station shares its frequency with Piscataway High School and is on the air 24/7/365.

Both groups have collaborated with the LAA on a number of events and programs, and we deeply appreciate their involvement and ties to the Livingston mission.
