Robert Breckenridge, coming to Livingston from Illinois in the mid-1980s, experienced a social awakening which reinforced his respect for those from different backgrounds.

Rick Apgar came to Livingston from rural Morris County, NJ, in the early 1970s, "while the Vietnam War was still raging although we were told it was winding down." He remembers a dorm mate, back from Vietnam, who was deeply affected by the racial tumult of the era, and a "spectacular" education by the likes of professors including Miguel Algarin.
