Loyal Sons and Loyal Daughters: On Saturday, April 9, Livingston College alumni Greg Brown ('82) and Jeffrey M. Isaacs ('84) will be among eight alumni honored by the Rutgers Alumni Association (RAA) as [Loyal Sons and Loyal Daughters of Rutgers](#).

Greg Brown is the Chairman of Rutgers' Board of Governors, and has served as a leader of other Rutgers governing bodies since 2003. His many accomplishments on behalf of Alma Mater include chairing the presidential search committee resulting in the hiring of President Robert Barchi, and providing leadership as Rutgers integrated most of the University of Medicine and Dentistry, including the reintegration of the former Rutgers Medical School (now Robert Wood Johnson Medical School). In 2012 Greg served as the University commencement speaker and received an honorary doctorate in humane letters. He has also been named as a Distinguished Alumnus by the Livingston Alumni Association ([in 2011](#)) and by the University ([Hall of Distinguished Alumni, 2010](#)).

For more than 25 years, Jeff Isaacs has been a steadfast volunteer as a board officer for the LAA and Rutgers University Alumni Federation, and a member of the Rutgers Board of Trustees. He also has partnered and volunteered for various RAA programs and events. Jeff has donated his skills as a business leader and financial strategist to his fellow alumni. In the

early 1990s he served as a catalyst to reinvent and revive the LAA and has served as the organization's President or Treasurer for almost a quarter of a century.
