

Fund Raising Update

July 1, 2003 marked the beginning of a new fiscal year at Rutgers University, and within the next couple of days alumni will receive a letter from the campaign chairman, Jim Cullen, announcing that this year will be the final year for the Rutgers University Capital Campaign. In this final campaign year Livingston College will continue to work towards raising funds for the college's unmet needs. Activities have been planned to aggressively move towards meeting the college's \$2 million campaign goal.

On Friday, December 5th at the Zimmerli Museum there will be a fund raising dinner that will pay tribute to the 10th year anniversary of Dr. Arnold G. Hyndman, as dean of Livingston College. Plans for the fundraiser include entertainment by Livingston alumnus, Ralph Peterson LC '84, and the former chair for the Department of Jazz, Dr. Laurence Ridley. The purpose of the event will be to raise funds for endowed scholarships in leadership education, and to honor Dr. Hyndman's 10 years of leadership at Livingston. We are very proud to announce that so far, a Livingston alumnus has donated a gift of \$250,000 towards this effort.

Livingston Wins First Place for Orientation Theme

For the second year in a row, Livingston College has won first place for Best Use of Thematic programming for its Summer 2002 Orientation/Welcome Week theme of "Grow Where You're Planted: Livingston College: - A Community With Roots". The award, earned in the Small School Category, was presented at the National Orientation Directors Association Conference held in Toronto in early November 2002. The winning theme was developed by Dean Robin Diamond. Jay Garrett LC '03 developed the web site. Livingston's Orientation program consists of two-day, small group Summer Orientation sessions and the Welcome Week Program at the beginning of the fall semester.

Baccalaureate degrees were conferred to 853 graduating Livingston students by President Richard L. McCormick at the University

Commencement on May 22, 2003. The LAA was proud to play an active role in both the University Commencement and Livingston College's 34th Commencement Convocation.

LC's 34th Commencement Convocation, in which all Livingston graduates participated, was held after the University

Commencement. Noted author, composer and musician James McBride gave the keynote address. Olivia Kenol was the Class Speaker and Kathleen Perry, President of the Class of 2003 bestowed the Class Gift – a leadership fund.

The Livingston Pride Award was presented to Kazim Rizvi. The graduation festivities concluded with a reception at the Livingston Student Center co-hosted by the LAA. Just minutes after becoming alumni, more than 200 new graduates joined the LAA, taking advantage of the LAA's free membership offer!

Reunion Recap

Livingston College Class Reunions of the 3' and 8's (73, 78, 83, 88, 93, 98) were held this spring in partnership with the Rutgers Alumni Associations' Reunion Weekend May 17, 2003. Facilitated by the efforts of the Livingston Alumni Association, about 60 Livingston Alumni and their guests joined, for the first time ever, Rutgers Alumni, College of Engineering Alumni, and the Mason Gross School Alumni at various RAA Reunion Weekend venues. LAA ventured into RAA's Reunion Weekend to add our Alumni to the already established RAA tradition, economize on planning efforts as well as costs, and to explore the possibilities for future combined RAA & LAA Alumni Reunions.

This unique flagship cooperation between LAA and RAA was spearheaded by Past President William Bauer (LC '86) and, former 2nd Vice President Robert Uhrig (LC '78). Both Bob and Bill felt it was time to try something new and believed that there was no reason to duplicate efforts of the already established RAA reunion weekend.
